Newsletter 1: Developments in the Perinatal Mental Health Service from 2016 to Present

What's Been Happening Across Wales?

In 2016, WG provided £1.5million to develop Perinatal Mental Health (PNMH) services that were equitable across Wales.

- 6 health boards used the money to shape Specialist Teams & Services
- 1 health board took a preventative and earlier intervention approach by upskilling midwives and health visitors and introducing nursery nurses into teams.

An All Wales PNMH Steering Group (AWPNMHSG), Community of Practice (CoP) and an Annual Conference, was established, bringing passionate and proactive colleagues together across Wales.

A number of task and finish groups looked at developing Core Curriculum and Training, Pathways, Data and Mother and Baby Inpatient Facilities.

- In <u>2016</u>, the Children, Young People & Education Committee (CYPE) undertook a review of PNMH services across Wales and in October 2017, <u>27 recommendations</u> were made
- <u>Jan 2018</u> first plenary debate on the committee's report.
- July 2018 AWPNMHSG, together with colleagues from 1000 Lives, produced and agreed on guidance for integrated PNMH services in Wales (All Wales '8' Standards) and guidance for the delivery of integrated perinatal mental health services in Wales.

- <u>Perinatal Mental Health Care in Wales</u> was published.
- Oct 2018 Cabinet Secretary for Health and Social Services has provided an update on the report recommendations.
- Nov 2018 Committee consulted stakeholders on the Welsh Government's response.
- Jan 2019 Minister for Health and Social Services was scrutinised on the progress of implementing the report's recommendations.
- May 2019 Chair of CYPE wrote to Minister of Health and Social Services acknowledged the progress made to date but raised deep concerns about the continued lack of progress in establishing Mother and Baby Unit provision in Wales.

The political spotlight is very much on the development of PNMH services across Wales.

So, Where Are We At Now?



In January 2019, the National Clinical Lead for PNMH role commenced, aiming to:

- Lead the Perinatal Mental Health Clinical Network, providing national leadership, coordination and expertise for the further development of perinatal mental health services and workforce;
- Develop quality standards, care pathways, professional competencies and training resources;
- Promote positive infant mental health and prevention of perinatal mental health problems;
- Develop an appropriately trained workforce;
- Collect and analyse agreed data.





Progress and Findings So Far

During January and March 2019 the PNMH Network Core Team have had the opportunity to get out and about to meet with staff, service users, third sector and voluntary agency colleagues. Three workshops were held and the following key themes were identified:

- 1. Partnerships
- 2. Performance
- 3. People
- 4. Pathways

Governance Arrangements

The PNMH Network Board Sub-Group and Clinical Group (CoP) will be strengthened through the agreement that it is now a subgroup of the All Wales Mental Health Board. This development should help to ensure that the Network and any related developments are fully integrated within the evolving All Wales All Ages agenda.

Current Situation and Way Forward



All Health Boards have been encouraged to:

- Establish/ re-establish local steering groups and identify representation for the PNMH Clinical Group (CoP) and Board (subgroup);
- **Benchmark** against the <u>'8 All Wales</u> Standards':
- Review Specialist Team staffing levels;
- Consider using the <u>Maternal Mental</u>
 <u>Health Alliance (MMHA)</u> Pathway

 Assessment Tool to understand present position across all service areas;
- Sign up to the <u>Perinatal Quality Network</u>
 (PQN);
- Undertake a training needs analysis.

The PNMH Network will:

- Review vision, mission, aims and objectives.
- Steer the direction and clarify the actions needed.
- Work together with other networks:
 - CAMHS and ED
 - Neonatal and Midwife

Networking & Connecting

As a network, we have met with colleagues across all Health Boards representing midwifery, health visiting, psychology, psychiatry, occupational therapy and specialist PNMH teams.

We've developed working links with public health, third sector and voluntary agencies such as MIND, NSPCC, APP, NCMH, PANDAS and Mental Health Foundation. Individuals from these organisations have been offered the opportunity to become part of our clinical (CoP) group and board/sub-group.

We recognise the importance of connection across Wales and have developed professional forums for specialist team leads, midwives, health visitors, occupational therapists and psychiatrists. However, we also recognise that we have work to do.

Staff Training

In June we held a two-day event offering training to Psychiatrists covering areas such as risks, prebirth planning, conception, safeguarding and personality disorders.
